Subject: Guidance Concerning Administration of Ability-to-Benefit Tests to Determine

Eligibility for TAP Awards

The 2006-07 State budget included a new provision regarding Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) awards for students, first receiving aid in 2006-07, who do not have a certificate of graduation from a recognized school providing secondary education within the United States. Since 1995, these students have been required to pass a federally approved ability-to-benefit test in order to be eligible to receive a TAP award. The new statutory provision requires the Commissioner of Education to define the "independent administration" of the ability-to-benefit tests for purposes of TAP awards.

To comply with this new statutory requirement, the State Education Department will develop regulations concerning the independent administration of the ability-to-benefit test which will go into effect for the winter 2007 semester. For the fall 2006 semester, all colleges and non-degree granting registered business schools, where students are eligible for TAP awards, must continue to follow the Federal regulations for the independent administration of ability-to-benefit examinations that qualify students for Federal student financial aid under Title IV of the Higher Education Act.

The Federal regulations on the independent administration of the ability-to-benefit test can be found in the Code of Federal Regulations, Part 668 - Student Assistance General Provisions, Subpart J - Approval of Independently Administered Tests; Specification of Passing Score; Approval of State Process.
